Instructions

As part of your Quality Improvement (QI) program requirements, you are required to complete a minimum of three activities from the list of options below.

The choice of your three activities from the menu below is entirely up to you. You are encouraged to complete the activities that would best inspire QI ideas within your specific practice area and setting.

After you complete each activity, you will be required to submit the name and date of completion for each activity you chose via your QI program page in the CPSO Portal. Three activities are required, but you are welcome to complete additional activities to obtain CPD credits, to provide feedback on the menu of options within the current QI program, and to inspire further QI ideas for your practice.

Menu of QI Activity Options (choose a minimum of 3) Documentation and record keeping link After completing CMPA's eLearning on documentation, randomly select five examples of your own documentation to review for improvement opportunities. You may find it helpful to review each example of your documentation in conjunction with CPSO's Medical Records Documentation and <u>Medical Records Management</u> policies to identify areas for QI. Effective communication: The key to creating reciprocal partnerships link CMPA's eLearning on effective communication and how variations on closed-loop communication can contribute to improved accuracy and patient safety when sharing information, and improved reciprocal partnership based on trust. Clinical reasoning: The impact of bias link CMPA's eLearning on recognizing the impact of implicit biases and how heuristics can affect patient care.
